- Staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development to ensure high quality teaching of PE/Sport

- Increased physical activity for pupils in both PE and playtimes

KS1 children had the experience of working in teams and were able to understand the competitive nature of competing against children from different schools. It also improved their understanding of the need for team work when competing in the different activities that were provided.
Supply cost for 2 teachers to attend the 5 CPD sessions	£1,000 Total cost of all supply was £2,808	The staff who attended the PE courses had their skills updated and then shared examples of good practice with the rest of the staff during SDM. This improved the quality of teaching in PE as the teachers felt more confident in delivering that aspect of the curriculum.

Cost of coaches to transport the 90 Year 1 children to The Regis for the interschool Infant Agility.	£430 Total costs was £910	By providing the transport to and from The Arena, all children had the opportunity to attend a sporting event outside of the school environment. This improved their confidence and introduced them to the competitive side of sport i.e. school against school.
Cost of 6 week fencing taster course for all Year 2 children	£900 Total cost £900	The children that took up the offer of the fencing provision all improved their balance and co-ordination. This inspired three of the children to continue to attend fencing sessions out of school.
Cost of PE Leadership time - e.g. audit and purchase new equipment, Revise SOW for dance, plan Sports Day activities	£1,000 See total supply costs above	The PE subject leader improved her knowledge and skills and then led two SDM (one on tennis and one on dance) to improve the skills of the staff in these two areas of the PE curriculum. Staff were more confident when teaching and planning these two areas of the curriculum as a result of these sessions.
Cost of supply for 2 teachers to attend afternoon rehearsals for West Sussex Dance House Festival at The Alexandra Theatre (Year 2 G&T Dance Club)	£200 See total supply costs above	This event gave the children the experience of performing in a professional theatre which improved their confidence in dance. They also needed to work co-operatively together as a team to perform their dance. They were also able to watch other schools/youth groups perform their pieces and compare the variety of dance performances.
Through school council class meetings and the Linking voices, children will vote on their choice of new playground markings. This will enable them to be more active at playtimes and in Year 1 outside area	£4,825 Total cost £4,825	The children voted on a variety of playground markings including an activity trail around the edge of the playground. These markings are used at playtimes as well as during outdoor PE lessons which is encouraging them to be more active. This will also help to improve well-being and health.
Resources to improve and extend PE curriculum throughout the school - general small apparatus i.e balls, skipping ropes & sports day medals etc	£500 Total costs £1,084.36	As a result of the CPD sessions that staff and the subject leader have attended, new equipment has been purchased to support the PE curriculum to improve the children's skills. Tennis was an area that has been introduced during the school year which has improved the balance and co-ordination of the children. As a result of these sessions in PE, the tennis club that runs on a Tuesday morning and afterschool led by coaches from Bognor Tennis Club had a waiting list. For National Sport's Week, the children are given to take home and keep – Rec kites, (they make the kites from kits), Year1 skipping ropes, Year2 small balls. The KS1 children are taught how to use this equipment during the week and are asked to set themselves a challenge for the end of the week. At the end of the week, the children evaluate their progress in using their equipment and then are able to take the equipment home to enable them to continue practising these skills out of school.
